**Substance Abuse in Criminal Justice Settings**  
**(Dept. approval 6/13/06)**

1. Students will demonstrate knowledge of the missions, purposes, goals, commonalities and differences of both the criminal justice system and community-based substance abuse treatment settings in order to work effectively with clients.
2. Students will compare the costs and risks of corrections-based and community-based addictions treatment and be conversant with and appreciative of efforts by both systems to work together to develop and support treatment plans for addicted clients in order to promote effective client treatment.
3. Students will describe profiles of substance abusing offenders and demonstrate a basic knowledge of topics related to providing effective treatment within criminal justice or community settings such as: managing infectious diseases, anger management, understanding theories of criminality, and working with dual-diagnosis clients.
4. Students will be able to demonstrate a basic understanding of the special ethical issues involved in providing treatment for substance abusing offenders such as confidentiality limitations, limitations to consent, and monitoring drug testing/enforcing sanctions in order to work effectively with clients.
5. Students will strengthen their competency in reading, writing, oral communication, and critical thinking in order to increase success in this and other courses and in the workplace.
